

Rules for fishing in Teton Springs

The lakes, ponds and streams within Teton Springs are provided for the enjoyment of the residents and resort guests within the Community. The intent of these guidelines is to enable these users to have maximum enjoyment of these amenities while avoiding negative impacts on the amenities for neighbors. Please adhere to the following rules while enjoying your time in Teton Springs.

- 1. Per Section 3.22 of the covenants, "No swimming, boating or ice skating shall take place on any lakes or ponds."
- 2. The lakes are stocked by the Homeowner Association with Yellowstone Cutthroat trout. The Warm Creek system for Yellowstone Cut Throat is a reproductive habitat. The Northern system is not reproductive and will be restocked as required. Lake banks and stream banks are fragile parts of the fish habitat. All of the lakes and streams are part of the open space that makes up the community. The 4 ponds that are stocked for fishing are: **Guide, Caddis, Copper John and Fireweed**.

Owners, residents and guests may fish from any point along the banks, other than from the golf course side of the lakes and streams. In areas where a home or cabin is adjacent to a lake or stream, we ask that owners, residents and guests first ask permission from the owner of the home or cabin prior to fishing directly in front of a home or cabin. There are designated fishing areas on the lake banks of the Warm Creek system. Fishing may occur only from designated fishing areas.

3. Fishing on all Teton Springs property is catch and release only. All fishing must be barb-less single hook artificial lure or flies, either using fly rods or spinning reels. No live bait, power baits, rubber baits, eggs or chumming is permitted at any time. To minimize damage to the fish and promote a Blue-Ribbon World-Class fishery, every effort must be made to return caught fish immediately to the water. No personal watercraft is permitted on Teton Springs' waterways. Float tubes for fishing may be used only on Guide Lake located to the west of the Teton Springs main entry.
